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Evtushenko S.V. Dynamics of variety of socio-determined thematic groups in British, Australian and Canadian linguistic cultures

The article focuses on the social stratification of the vocabulary of modern English language and detecting similar ethno-cultural specific features of verbs in British, Australian and Canadian varieties of modern English in the sociolinguistic format. The scientific novelty of this paper is that socio-determined thematic groups of the generating base of British, Australian and Canadian verbs in modern English language were first identified and compared and the role of word formation in the completion of lexical and grammatical class of verbs is determined.
