## Law status of the Supreme Privy Council (1726-1730)

It is expanded the legal status of the Supreme Privy Council, it is stated that it had a very significant powers, as de facto separate periods of its activity, for example, during the nominal reign of Peter II juvenile highest organ of state power in the country.
