### **Between the realism and the constructivism: onticology**

It has been studied modern discourses concerning the nature of reality. An argument between realists and constructivists is actualized basing on the example of philosophical stream, which had been called object-oriented ontology or onticology. Basing on the analysis of works written by B.Latour, G.Harman, L.Bryant the author explicates its distinctive features: 1) denial of the gap between culture and nature, subject and object; 2) endowment of each object with intentionality and the ability to build its reality; 3) statement of the presence of secondary qualities for all objects. The author summarizes that onticology can be defined as a radical relativistic-solipsistic constructivism rather than ontological realism.
