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To the question of similarity / non- similarity of a complex syntactic unit and complex sentence in modern linguistics of the text

Recently, the coordinate constructions have aroused a keen interest from the rapidly developing linguistics of the text, one of the problems of which concerns "the relationship between simple, compound, complex sentences, on the one hand, and sequences of independent sentences — on the other. However, the question of when, for expression some information uses one, perhaps, complex sentence, and when — a few sentences, it has not yet been systematically studied. It is therefore interesting to consider when the compound sentence is used to express certain specific information, as well as when it is a complex syntactic unit with a coordinate conjunction and to reveal the features of similarities and differences of these coordinate constructs.
