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### **Morphematic links and productivity of word-formative formulating affixes in multi-systemic languages**

In the nature of the interrelationships that exist between a word, a foundation and a form-building on the one hand, and word-forming affixes, on the other, there is a clear difference between grammatical abstraction and lexico-word-formation abstraction. In the process of developing and improving the language, a number of word-building and form-making elements change (expands or, on the contrary, narrows) their ties, and with it their productivity, that is, their producing qualities. The number of words and bases, in the sphere of which one or another word-formation affixes are used, turns out to be much more dependent on the nature of the word or basis. There is a constant relationship between the diversity and certainty of the morphematic connections of an affix and its productivity, its producing qualities. The wider and richer the connection of this affix with words and basics, the more productive it is, and vice versa.
