Polite communicative personality in the space of an English detective (based on the novel by A. Christie «The Mystery of King's Abbot»)

The relevance is due to the continuing interest of linguists in the study of politeness strategies and varieties of language personalities. Polite language personality, observing the principles of politeness accepted in its linguistic culture in most communicative situations, can be added to the typology of language personalities. An example of such a personality is the private detective Hercule Poirot, the character of the novels by A. Christie. The article identifies speech strategies typical of a polite language personality (accentuated politeness, intimacy of communication, egalitarianism, optionality, etc.), as well as describes its paraverbal characteristics and specific features of nonverbal behavior. Verbal, para - and non-verbal means typical of a polite language personality in the complex provide maximum comfort and priority of the interlocutor, taking care of his/her feelings.
