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Onomasiological and logical-semantic principles of differentiation of nominal phrases and nominal composites.

The problem of distinguishing terminological phrases and nominal composites is considered when formal features are not relevant. It is shown that the logical-semantic differentiation principle is based on the presence of proportionality of the defining and definable components of a complex education. In terminological phrases-floronyms, the components are characterized by signs of nominative self-sufficiency. In endo-/exocomposites-floronyms, the self-sufficiency of the components occurs due to the involvement of definitional information. The onomasiological principle of differentiation is defined in hyponymous-hyperonymous concepts. Endocomposites-floronyms record floronymic activity at the species hyperonymic level, and terminological phrases-floronyms – at the subspecific hyponymic level.
