Revival and influence of Slavophile ideas in contemporary Russian state policy

The article examines the revival and influence of the ideas of Slavophilism in modern Russian state policy. The authors analyze how historical concepts that originated in the 19th century are adapted and integrated into modern political strategies and discussions. Examples of the use of Slavophile ideas in the formation of national identity and strengthening patriotism are considered.
