Lexical-semantic, grammatical and orthoepical features of the modern English British variant

The article examines the types of the British English, explores and describes the features of the language changes at the phonetic, lexical, syntactic levels in oral and written speech within three types: conservative English (conservative), received standard (received pronunciation), advanced English. Descriptive analysis showed that the third type of national standard Received Pronunciation (Advanced) RP is subject to the greatest changes. The structure of this language type differs from prescriptive norms and is characterized by variability in lexical and grammatical forms.
