Peculiarities and cognitive mechanisms of cross-cultural communication

The article presents the results of studying the possibility of mutual understanding between representatives of different linguistic cultures, as well as an attempt to identify true and false information in different cultures at the verbal and non-verbal levels. It is shown that in a globalized world it is not enough to speak English in order to understand each other, since communication is a broader concept than "speaking" and includes gestures that vary from culture to culture and often have opposite meanings, interpersonal distances, expressions, clothes, objects, grammars. The importance of detecting lies in everyday oral and written communication based on linguistic analysis is emphasized.
