The relationship between Russian philosophy and Russian religious culture of the 10th – early 20th centuries and the problem of personality

It is substantiated that Russian philosophy and Russian religious culture of the 10th – early 20th centuries are connected with each other by the study of the problem of the human personality and the commonality of its interpretation. The novelty of the research lies in the fact that, firstly, it is substantiated that Russian philosophy and Russian culture are connected with each other by personalistic issues, and, secondly, the concept of personality is explicated, through the prism of which domestic philosophy and culture of the 10th – early 20th centuries were connected. It is concluded that from the point of view of Russian religious culture of the 10th – early 20th centuries, personality is a morally independent subject who implements the Orthodox spiritual ideal in his activities, capable of making choices and bearing responsibility for them. This definition of personality is explicated within the framework of Russian religious philosophy. It is shown that in Russian religious culture, in addition to Russian religious philosophy, this interpretation of personality was implicit.
