Concepts of studying lexical units with emotional semantics

Utterances that arbitrarily express emotions without influencing the addressee, that is, emotional utterances, are studied. It is noted that when an utterance is intentional, conscious and aimed at influencing the addressee, while using specially selected emotive means, such as vocabulary, syntax and intonation, it becomes emotive. It is shown that vocabulary with emotional semantics reflects the emotional aspects presented in the language, including lexical and semantic components.
